MESSAGE FROM BOARD OF TRUSTEES PRESIDENT CLYDE THOMPSON:

"This past year marked the beginning of a new era for our 45-year old Sunriver Music Festival, with newly appointed Artistic Director & Conductor Brett Mitchell at the helm.

Brett brought his own fresh perspective to August's landmark Summer Festival, with programs that both entertained and educated. In the opening concert, he showcased several of our orchestral musicians as soloists in Ginastera's *Variaciones concertantes*. Later, he brought to us the internationally acclaimed violinist William Hagen in a performance of Brahms' Violin Concerto. Another outstanding soloist appearing with the orchestra was the young Ukrainian pianist, Dmytro Choni, performing Beethoven's third Piano Concerto. Both concertos were highlights of the Festival, and in both, Brett showed himself to be masterful at leading the orchestra in an accompanying role. Most importantly, the orchestra responded to Brett in all the concerts with enthusiasm and a high level of musicality that promises to only increase in the coming years.

Brett paid us a visit in June and attended the annual Young Artist Scholarship recital. We saw another side of Brett that we hadn't seen, nor had been looking for - he proved himself to be a fine teacher when he coached the students individually after their recital, offering advice on performance demeanor as well as giving excellent musical instruction.

Sunriver Music Festival is blessed to have a strong staff and a superb Executive Director, Meagan Iverson. Julie Friedman (Patron Services Coordinator), and AJ Jimenez (Production Assistant) are soon beginning their second and third years on the staff, respectively.

Our former Executive Director, Pam Beezley, continues to play an important role in the Festival's development through grant writing. Her work, and the grants we've received through Covid relief legislation, have helped keep us financially stable through the past two years. The Festival is now in enviably strong shape coming out of the pandemic.

This past year we resumed almost all of our normal activities: the Valentine's Dinner & Dance Concert featuring the Blue Skies Big Band from Eugene; Piano Showcase, which this year brought in Michael Allen Harrison and three of his colleagues; Festival Faire gala with its accompanying fundraising auction; and the Swings fore Strings golf tournament. Only the annual Christmas concert was cancelled, a decision that had to be made when Covid protocols and financial uncertainty were still large factors. The scholarship auditions and recital took place right on schedule, and in fact they never missed a beat during the pandemic.

Our Board of Trustees continues to focus on regenerating itself with new members, especially with people who can offer skills that are particularly needed. At the end of this past fiscal year, just a month ago, the Board held an all-day Strategic Planning session. Brett Mitchell joined us during the session via zoom, and together we worked to clarify both our identity and our direction forward into the coming years."




<u>Note:</u>

This includes donations from individuals as general donations and also restricted donations to Young Artists Scholarships, Music Education, Sawyer Fund for Orchestra Compensation, and also Concert Sponsors. In the 2021/2022 fiscal year, the Festival returned an operating surplus thanks to strong community support and one-time government relief funding due to the pandemic. The 2022 surplus funds will assist in adjusting to the financial demands throughout the uncertainty of the upcoming year. With the continued concerns about covid and its financial impact, we are in a positive position to carry forward funds and steward donations received in the 45th season on into the 46th season for their intended purpose.




